

Hill Climb

What is a Hill Climb or Sprint

Quite simply a hill climb or sprint is a speed event in which the driver is against the clock over a set course, usually a permanent motor sport venue, with the aim to be the quickest car in its class. A 'Sprint', or occasionally 'Speed Trial', takes place on a flat course such as Croft circuit and a 'Hill Climb' takes place, unsurprisingly, on a course with a gradient. There are more hill climb and sprint venues in the country than any other motor sport.

Drivers usually have the opportunity of two practice runs and 2 competition runs.

What do I need to take part in a Speed event

Your car will require a Eligibility Document.

It is mandatory for competitors to carry a Fire Extinguisher. 2 x 1 litre extinguishers are acceptable.

You are required to have personal safety equipment that complies with MSA Regulations, the items listed below are mandatory requirements:

- Overalls, Helmets to comply with current MSA blue book standards.
- Gloves are required to be Fire Resistant and are mandatory.
- Boots which are Fire Resistant are strongly recommended.

The above list is not exhaustive; you will also need to consult the current year's MSA Competitors' and Officials' Yearbook in addition to individual event Supplementary Regulations.
